

# CLARENCE STREET ENTRANCE TO WYNYARD STATION NOW OPEN

**OPENED IN DECEMBER, THE CLARENCE STREET ENTRANCE PROVIDES A NEW WESTERN ENTRANCE TO WYNYARD STATION AND MARKS THE COMPLETION OF THE WYNYARD WALK PROJECT.**

This new station entrance on the corner of Clarence Street and York Lane (near Margaret Street) is fully accessible with escalators and lifts between Wynyard Walk tunnel and street level.

This entrance also links to the re-opened Kent Street tunnel providing easy access to 275 Kent Street.

Inside the Clarence Street Entrance is #Wynscreen – a new public art installation featuring digital art to view and enjoy.

**The Clarence Street Entrance and Wynyard Walk tunnel are now open 24 hours a day.**

Transport for NSW is continuing work on phase two of the Wynyard Station Upgrade.

From January 2017, the York Street entrance to Wynyard Station will be closed while the lobby is refurbished. The refurbishment will include a new lift and upgraded escalators to make it easier and safer for customers to access Wynyard Station from York Street.

## WELCOME TO WYNSCREEN

Come inside to see Wynscreen – a 23-metre wide curved LED screen featuring digital artwork from some of Australia's leading artists.

Situated on the mezzanine level, this is a Transport for NSW first. The screen will enhance the walk to and from Wynyard Station for Sydneysiders, commuters, tourists and art lovers alike.

Purpose-designed and built, Wynscreen is dedicated as a public art site.

Wynscreen showcases a diverse range of specially commissioned works by a variety of Australian artists, animators, designers and choreographers.

It brings the world of innovative digital art to everyone, every day.







## WYNYARD STATION UPGRADE CONTINUES

### York Street entrance closing soon

From January 2017, the York Street entrance to Wynyard Station will be temporarily closed while the lobby is refurbished.

Customers can continue to access Wynyard Station from George Street, Carrington Street, through Wynyard Walk and the MetCentre. The York Street entrance is expected to re-open in late 2017.

### Heat relief system trial on Platforms 3 and 4

In December 2016, Transport for NSW is temporarily installing a heat relief system prototype on a small section of platforms 3 and 4. This trial aims to test the prototype's effectiveness in providing heat relief to customers.

The trial will be considered in terms of feasibility, cost and benefit. Customer feedback will be sought and considered as part of this process.

The trial will run until late January 2017.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH THE ESCALATORS?

As part of the York Street entrance upgrade, the four wooden escalators will be replaced to improve both customer safety and access in and out of one of Sydney's busiest stations.

A plan, known as a Heritage Interpretation Strategy, has been developed to document the heritage significance of the York Street lobby including the escalators. This will be approved by the Heritage Council of NSW.

Heritage elements, such as the art deco timber panelling, will be incorporated into the new design and finishes, where appropriate.

## WYNYARD PLACE NOW UNDERWAY

The Wynyard Place project includes a major upgrade of Wynyard Station's George Street entrance, creating a grand transit hall and public concourse. Wynyard Place is targeted for completion in 2020. For more information visit [www.buildingwynyardplace.com](http://www.buildingwynyardplace.com)
